Because of his capability to lead, we selected Mr. J. W. Westbrook as our class advisor to help us in our efforts.


And now may the blessings that ever attend the noble and good and true, follow and abide with us each and all, now and forevermore.

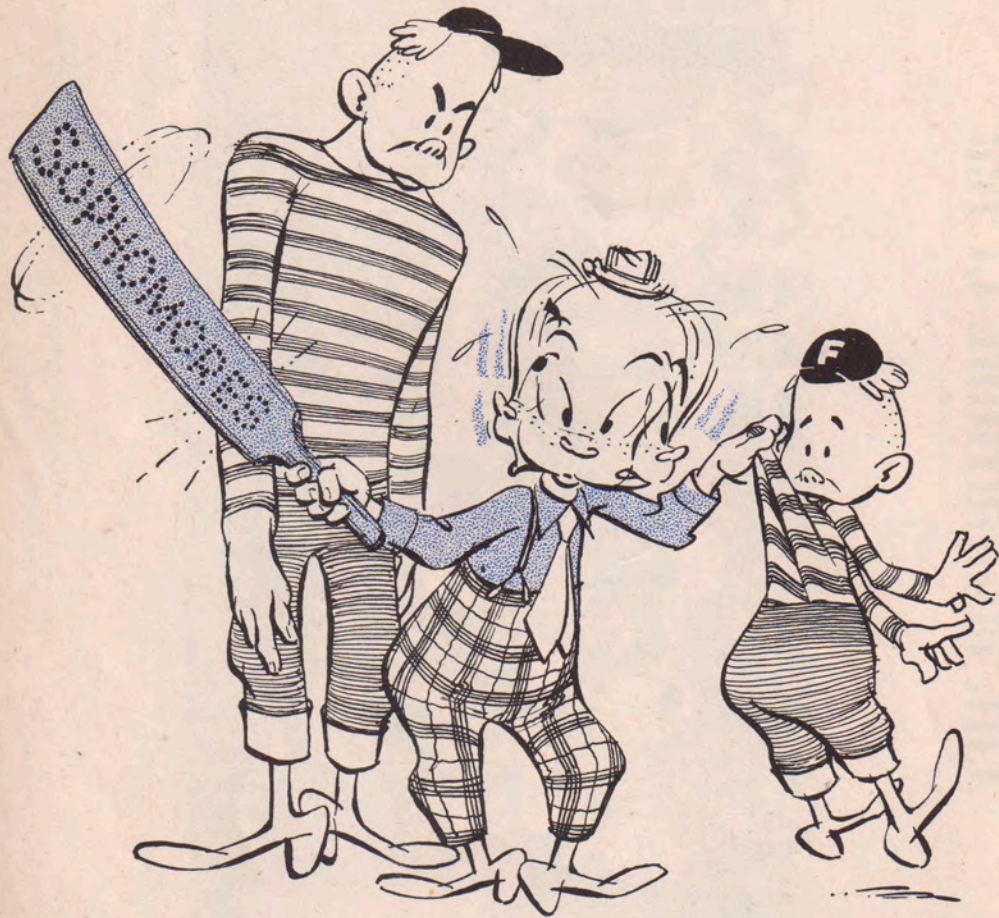
When the Juniors are Seniors next year they will have decided by then:



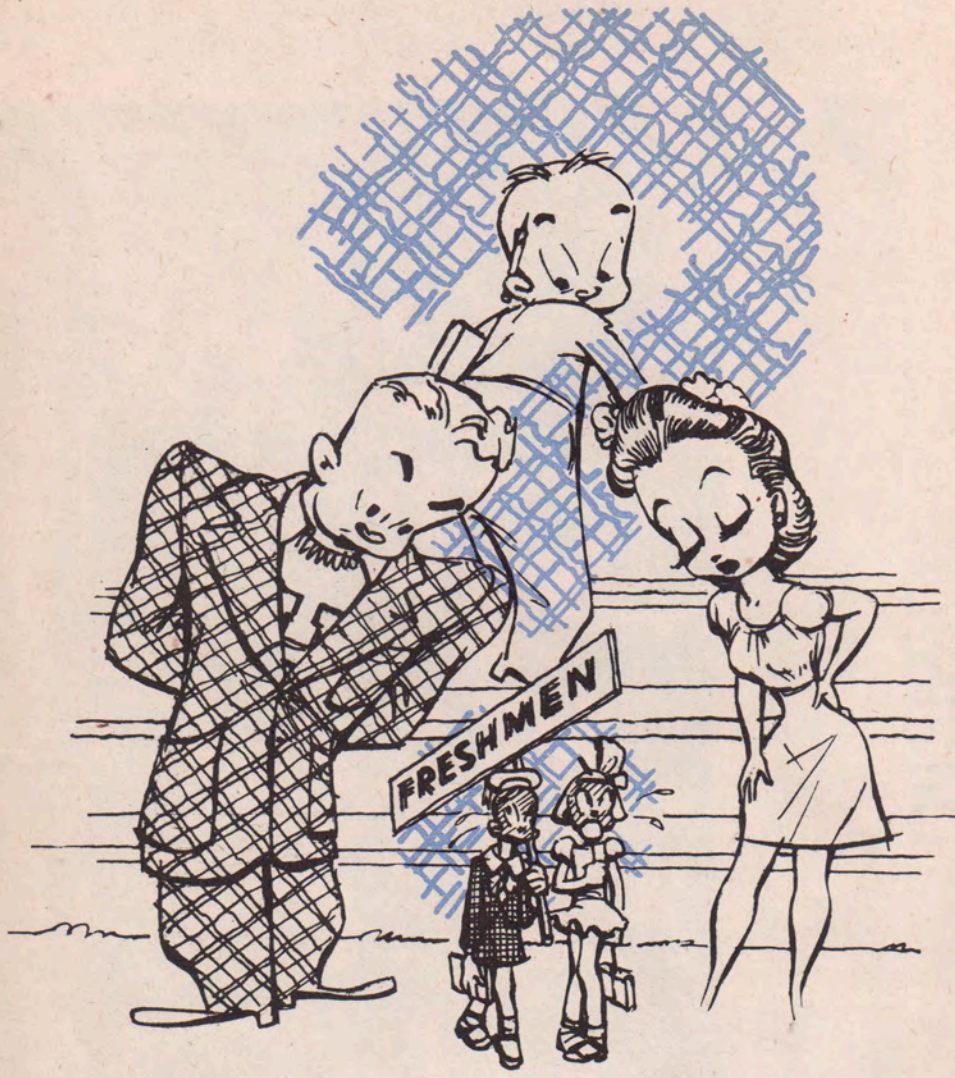
SOPHOMORES

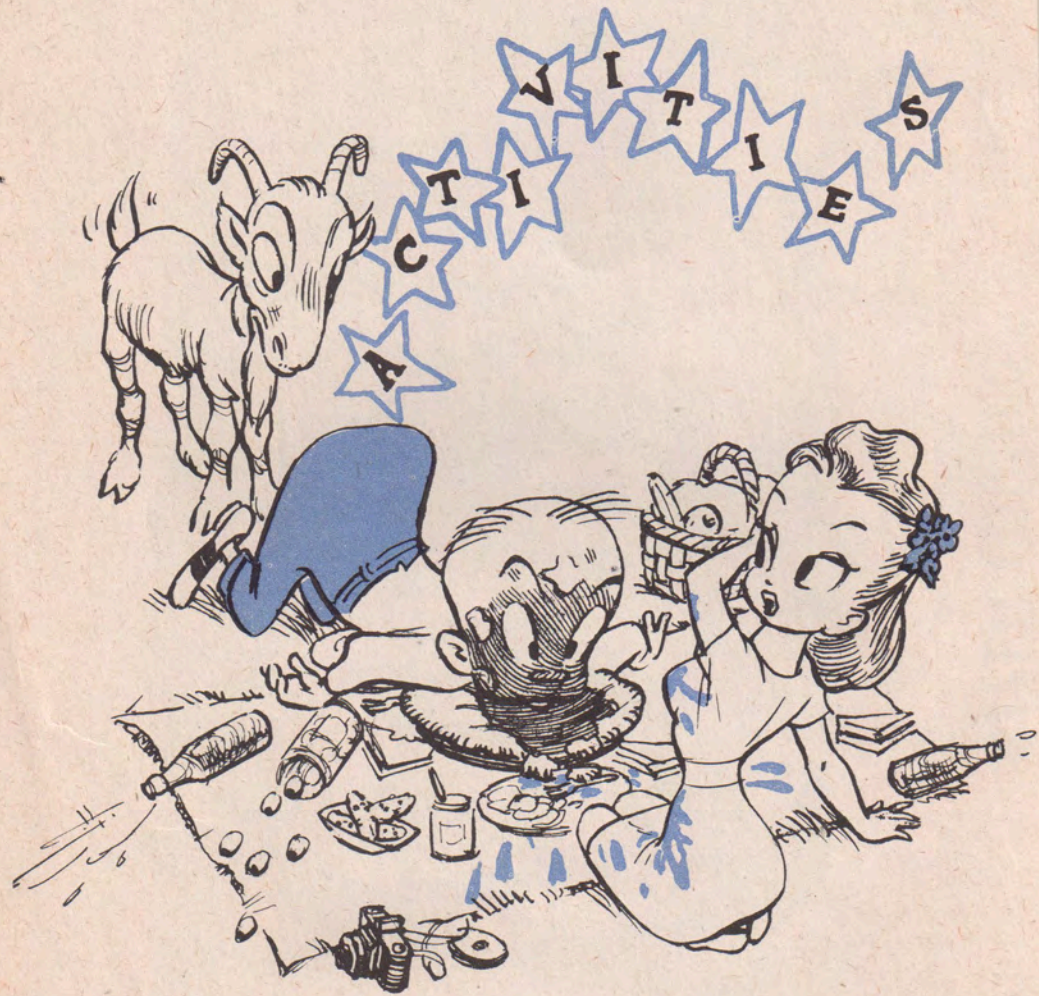
FRESHMAN CLASS

We are anxiously awaiting the time when we shall become Seniors, so as to prove our merit and take the places that are being vacated by the graduates.

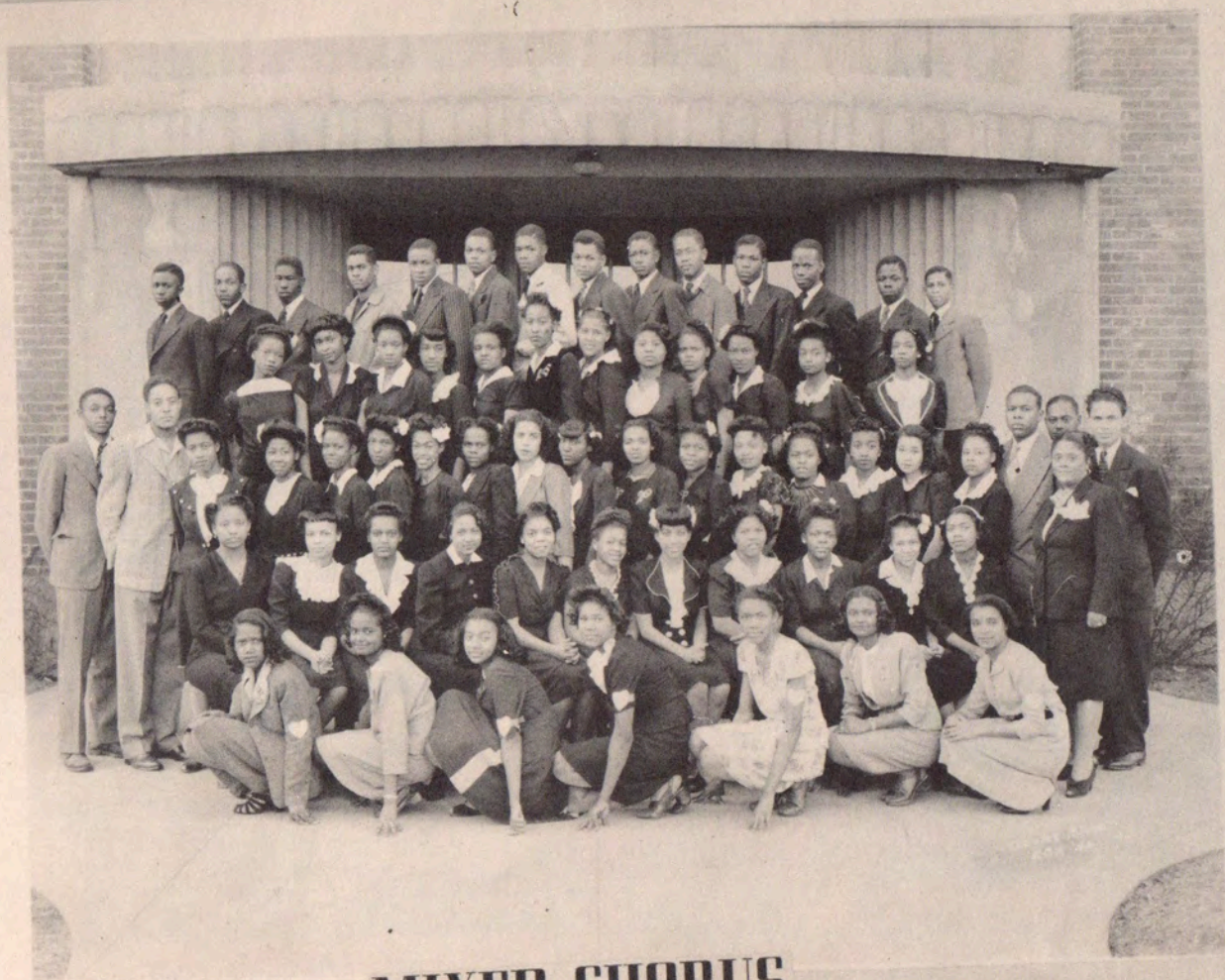

Next year, when we return as Sophomores, we shall have acquired the experience that will enable us to do more and better things.

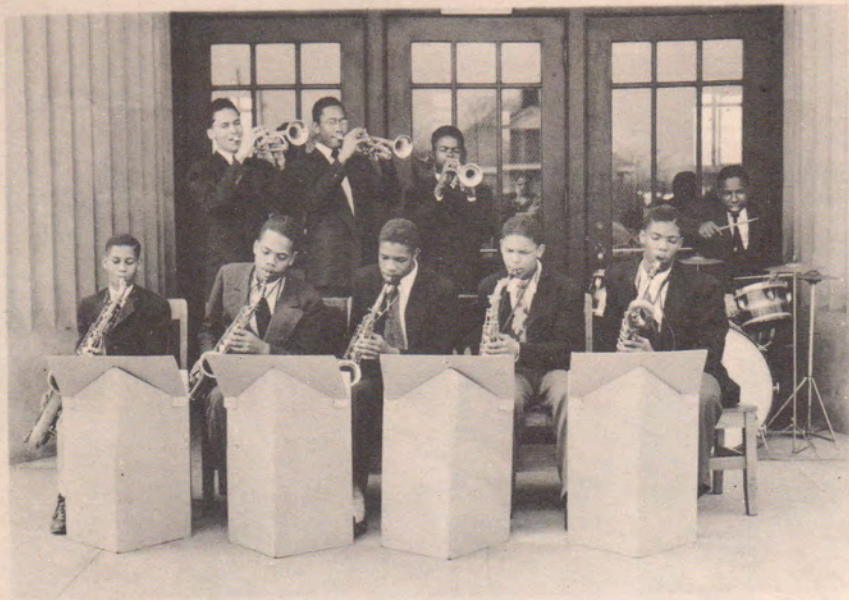


THE MELROSE BUZZER

Articles that are being made by the boys include cedar chests, chest of drawers, vanity stools, twin bed tables, lamps, coffee tables and other useful articles. Our shop is under the supervision of Mr. Dorsey West.

SCIENCE DEPARTMENT

A visit to our Science Department will convince one that ours is on par with any in the state. Individual work is stressed as much as possible. All classes perform experiments or do laboratory work that brings them in contact with the things about which they study.

In Biology, the students have worked with worms, fish, frogs, snakes and cats, with each student handling the specimen at least once.

In Chemistry such poison gases as chlorine, Bromine, Hydrogen Sulfide and Hydrogen Chloride have been prepared. Courses offered are General Science, Biology, Chemistry and Physics.
